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WORKING WITH SMALL PARTS?

- Using a toothpick or small stick is an old trick that works well.
- It is also common to spread a bit of glue on a piece of paper.
- Sometimes that paper can get lost or move if

USEFUL FOR WORKING WITH SMALL PARTS



- Consider using a glue caddy like this
- The small cups can hold any type of glue or paint
- Adding weight to the caddy makes it more convenient to handle.

AN OVERVIEW



THE BODY OF THE CADDY



**Build the caddy to
half an index card
when done**

STORE PAPER AND CUPS IN BASE

This base can be used to store paper and cups in one convenient place.

Include a few pennies for added weight



The LID



- The lid is made from two layers of scrap wood.
- Make the (2) holes in the upper layer larger than the bottom. This holds the cups in place and makes it easier to remove them when desired.

UNDERSIDE OF LID

**Add a bit of bracing
on the underside to
keep the wood from
warping**



COMPLETED CADDY





Almost any kind of paper can be used for the top. Shown here is half an index card.



ANOTHER CADDY

- This caddy comes in handy for painting small parts or details.
- One Large cup is filled with thinner.
- The other large cup can be used for a mixed color.
- The others are used for colors.





- This box is also filled with pennies
- It can be used for glueing
- It can be used for painting
- It can even be used in a weight for emergencies
